

**HUAPAI GOLF CLUB (INC)  
REGULATIONS & BY-LAWS**

**ETIQUETTE**

- **Members are urged to observe the etiquette of the game and thus ensure the enjoyment of golf for all Members and visitors.**
- **Walk quickly between strokes.**
- **Do not talk or move while a stroke is being made.**
- **Do not play a stroke until those ahead are out of range.**
- **When searching for a ball which may be lost, call the next players through and, once having done so, allow them to proceed even if the ball may be found in the meantime.**
- **Your place in the field is directly behind the group in front of you .. NOT directly in front of the group behind you. If you have lost more than a complete hole behind the players in front, you have lost your place in the field and should give way to players behind. SLOW PLAY WILL NOT BE CONDONED.**
- **Please rake bunkers after playing a stroke and leave the rake INSIDE the bunker with the handle pointing in the direction of play.**
- **In order to maintain your course, please replace divots, repair pitch marks on the greens and, on completion of the hole, repair spike marks. Avoid practice swings on tees and keep trundlers clear of wet patches around greens and tees. Trundlers should be kept to the outer-side of green-side bunkers wherever practicable.**
- **Motorised transport must be driven in the rough unless otherwise stated and kept at least 10 metres away from greens and surrounds.**

**HANDICAPS**

**The method of handicapping shall be as laid down by New Zealand Golf in their current Handicap and Course Rating System. Members should acquaint themselves with their CURRENT HANDICAP INDEX AND COURSE HANDICAP before commencing play. The Golf Committee expects a scorecard to be returned for every stipulated round played. Players not returning cards for handicapping purposes will be assessed under the terms of the handicapping system. Players involved in OFFICIAL MATCH PLAY must return a score card for handicapping purposes, providing a minimum of 13 holes have been played.**

**IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERY PLAYER TO ENSURE THAT THEIR SCORE CARD IS CORRECTLY AND CLEARLY FILLED IN, (INCLUDING THE CORRECT DATE) SIGNED AND ATTESTED, AND PLACED IN THE BOX PROVIDED. IN A HANDICAP EVENT, THE PLAYER'S CORRECT HANDICAP INDEX AND COURSE HANDICAP MUST BE SHOWN - RULE 6-6.**

### **COURSE PRIORITY**

Contestants in match play competitions shall have the right of way. Play shall normally be conducted in groups of four. A single player has no standing on the course and shall stand aside and allow groups of two or more to play through. Practice on the course shall be restricted to the play of no more than two balls, and should not hold up groups playing behind.

### **STARTING TIMES**

Starting time means **ON THE TEE**. Players must report to the Starter immediately upon arrival at the course and are further requested to be ready to play at least 10 minutes before the scheduled starting time in case of cancellations. The Starter is authorised, at his discretion, to make up groups in order to maximise course utilisation and to maintain the smooth flow of the field. Players are asked to co-operate in this respect. Play in "fives" may be permitted provided that they cause no delay. At other times the form of the competition, such as four-somes, may permit play in "sixes". Tee booking may be made seven days in advance except for Saturdays when bookings may be made from 7am on the preceding Saturday. Members should refer to the Tee Booking system to establish the availability of starting times on any day of the week. If it is necessary to cancel or amend your starting time, it is common courtesy to withdraw your name. Penalties are provided in the Rules of Golf, Rule 6-3 for failure to start on time.

### **DISPUTES AND PROTESTS**

Any dispute or protest concerning any competition or match must be made in writing to the Golf Committee immediately upon the completion of such competition or match and such dispute will be dealt with as early as possible by the Golf Committee whose decision shall be final.

### **DRESS STANDARDS**

All players representing the club are expected to comply with the following dress code standards, including shirts tucked into trousers/shorts.

All members and visitors must comply to a high standard of dress.

Golf shoes worn on the course must not be worn in the clubhouse.

The following are not acceptable either on the course or in the clubhouse:

Beach, athletic or sports shorts

Collarless shirts, singlets, tank tops or track suits

T shirts or shirts bearing overt advertising

Dirty, wet or torn clothing

Jandals, cleated or ridged sole shoes.

Please remove hats when in the clubhouse.

The list is a guideline only. Any club official will determine the minimum acceptable standard and that decision is final.

**MEMBERS ARE REQUESTED TO ENSURE THAT THEIR GUESTS  
OBSERVE THESE REQUIREMENTS.**

**SHARING OF CLUBS IS PROHIBITED**

Every player must possess a set of clubs. Sharing of clubs is not permitted except in Club competitions and only in accordance with the provisions of Rule 4-4b.

**CHILDREN**

Children under the age of 10 YEARS are not permitted on the course. Otherwise, children, other than Junior Members, are not permitted on the course or in the Clubhouse unless accompanied by, and under the control of their parents or guardians.

**ACCESS TO COURSE**

Access to and egress from the Club's property by all members and visitors is confined to the entrance and exit from Coatesville-Riverhead Highway.

**MOTORISED TRANSPORT**

The Board of Directors recognises that the use of motorised transport on the course can extend the playing life of a golfer. Furthermore, the availability of motorised carts for hire is increasing whilst at the same time, privately-owned vehicles, including motorcycles are becoming more popular.

Such vehicles are permitted on the course, subject to the Golf Committee's approval providing they meet the minimum specifications concerning noise levels, emissions and tyre widths. In the case of privately owned vehicles, storage, security and insurance are entirely at the owner's/lessees' risk and cost. Storage of such vehicles must have the approval of the Board of Directors. Storage fees will apply. Children under the age of 15 are prohibited from driving motorised transport anywhere on club property.

Storage of fuel, for petrol driven vehicles on the Club's premises is prohibited.

The charging of batteries for electrically powered vehicles using the club's energy sources is also prohibited.

No advertising, other than the makers' name and instructions for use, may be carried on any vehicle except that the Board reserves the right, on application by the owner(s)/lessee(s), to consider exceptions to this ban.

Battery-powered trundlers are not considered to be motorised transport.

**DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES**

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures **DISTANCE ONLY**. However, if during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device that is **DESIGNED** to gauge or measure other conditions that might effect his/her play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature etc) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3 for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

**CAR PARKING**

In consideration of others, Members are requested to park their cars carefully and in such a manner so as to ensure that the greatest number of cars can be accommodated. Please observe those places reserved for members of the Board

**of Directors, Golf Committee and staff. UNAUTHORISED VEHICLES WILL BE TOWED AWAY.**

**Private motor vehicles are not to be driven on to the course without permission first being obtained from the General Manager.**

**Subject to weather and ground conditions members may drive their vehicles to strategic points on the course when a shotgun start occurs.**

### **GREEN FEES**

**Members are reminded that green fees must be paid for any guest that the Member may introduce to the Club. Guests of Members may not play before 1.00pm on Saturdays except with the prior approval of the General Manager. Guests' behaviour is the responsibility of the member at all times that the guest is at the Club. Green fee players must present themselves to the Starter or the person in charge of the course before they will be allowed to play. Green fee players incorrectly dressed will be asked to change into more appropriate attire or requested to leave the Course.**

**The Board of Directors or its authorised representative reserves the right to refuse admission to the course and refuse service to any person whose demeanor, behaviour or dress standard does not comply with the Club By-Laws.**

### **TRUNDLERS & TRUNDLER ROOM**

**During the winter season, usually from June through to October, only trundlers with wide wheels will be permitted on the course. Only those members who have rented space may use the Trundler room. The charging of batteries for electrically powered trundlers is prohibited. To ease congestion, Members MUST fold down, retract or remove handles from trundlers. To assist in keeping the floor area in the trundler room clean, please hose down trundlers and clean shoes to remove excess mud and grass before storing. FOR SECURITY REASONS, THE TRUNDLER ROOM DOOR MUST BE LOCKED BEFORE AND AFTER USE.**

### **RECIPROCAL RIGHTS.**

**The Club enjoys reciprocal rights with the following golf clubs in New Zealand and overseas - Northland Golf Club Whangarei, St Michaels Golf Club New South Wales, Wynnum Golf Club Queensland, Blackwood Golf Club, Blackwood South Australia. Reciprocal rights may apply within the North Harbour Golf Association when the Club is hosting Association events. These will be advised from time to time and applications must be made through the General Manager. Any member intending to visit St Michaels Golf Club must have a letter of introduction from the General Manager.**

### **PENNANTS**

**The club traditionally enters both Men's and Women's teams in the North Harbour Golf Association Pennant Competitions.**

**Expressions of interest are called for around the middle of November each year by placing entry sheets on the notice boards in the Men's and Women's locker rooms.**

**CONTRACTING STAFF – GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE LTD**

Contracting staff have priority on the course for maintenance purposes at all times. No contract staff will be directly reprimanded by any individual Member.

**GREENS MAINTENANCE:**

If a green or surrounds are being worked upon by maintenance staff and the pin is not in the hole, players are not to hit to the green until the flag is replaced and the green is cleared or they are called up.

**FAIRWAY AND ROUGH MAINTENANCE:**

Players must wait for an approaching vehicle or mower to pass behind or out of range before playing their shots. Alternatively golfers may be called on to play their shots but only at the discretion of the vehicle or mower operator.

**OTHER SITUATIONS:**

Players must receive acknowledgement from the maintenance staff or other players who are in range before playing a shot.

**GOLFERS ARE EXPECTED TO TAKE REASONABLE PRECAUTIONS AT ALL TIMES TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL PERSONS ON THE COURSE.**

**COURSE & CLUBHOUSE TIDINESS**

The Board of Directors requests that Members assist in maintaining tidiness. Please use the receptacles on the course for rubbish and discarded wrappings. Ensure that golf shoes and other equipment are clean and free from grass and mud before entering the Locker Room area. Treat the showers and toilets as you would in your own home. Empty bottles and glasses must be returned to the bar.

**YOUR CO-OPERATION WILL BE APPRECIATED.**

**SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN ALL AREAS OF THE CLUBHOUSE.**

**BAR, LOUNGE & CLUBHOUSE HOURS**

The Bar hours are displayed in the Lounge. These hours may be varied at the discretion of the Board of Directors in accordance with the Club's license. The Bar Manager has the right to refuse service to any person if, in his / her opinion, that person's demeanor is not in accordance with the acceptable behavior and dress standards do not comply with the Club's By-Laws. The Bar Manager is responsible to ensure that Bar opening and closing hours are observed.

In normal circumstances the Lounge and Clubhouse are to be vacated and secured THIRTY MINUTES AFTER BAR CLOSING TIME. At other times the premises may remain open at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

All liquor containers and drinking vessels will be cleared away from the Lounge 30 MINUTES after Bar closing time.

**LIQUOR PURCHASES AT THE BAR MUST BE CONSUMED IN THE CLUBHOUSE. THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL ON THE COURSE IS ACTIVELY DISCOURAGED.**

### **SALE OF LIQUOR**

**Liquor will not be sold to persons under the age of 18. Evidence of age by way of a passport, photo drivers license or a Hospitality Association 18+ card may need to be produced. A person under the age of 18 may have access to the bar providing they are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and the liquor is supplied to them by their parent or legal guardian.**

### **SUGGESTIONS AND COMPLAINTS**

**Suggestions are welcomed. These must be in writing to the General Manager who, if required, will refer them for action to the Board of Directors or the appropriate sub-Committee.**

**A Suggestions Box is situated on the wall in the members lounge to the left of the gas heater on the lower level.**

### **MEMBERS' RIGHTS**

Members have the right to ensure that the Club's Regulations and By-Laws are observed, especially by visitors and green fee players. To this extent, any Member has the right to speak directly to any person seen to be in breach of the Rules, in particular, those pertaining to the Rules of Golf misconduct, unacceptable dress standards and damage to the course and property including trespass. Any incident must be reported immediately to the Board of Directors or the General Manager. Members are especially reminded to respect the rights and privacy of the Club's near neighbours.

### **DISCIPLINARY POLICY**

The Board of Directors shall appoint a Disciplinary Committee to “Exercise discipline over members participating in events conducted by the club, or in respect of conduct reflecting unfavourably on the game or the club, wherever it may occur”.

The Disciplinary Procedures Policy is posted on the notice board.

### **SUBSCRIPTIONS IN ARREARS**

Any member who is in arrears after the last day for payment will not be permitted access to the course until such time as the overdue amount is paid. In addition, the members name will be removed from the Handicap Index Board. Non financial members will have their record frozen in the New Zealand Golf Handicapping System.

### **ADDRESSES AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS**

Every member shall advise the General Manager of any change of address or telephone number.

### **RESIGNATIONS**

**ANY MEMBER OF THE CLUB WISHING TO RESIGN MUST NOTIFY THE GENERAL MANAGER IN WRITING NOT LATER THAN 31 AUGUST IN EACH YEAR. FAILURE TO DO SO RENDERS THE MEMBER LIABLE FOR THE NEW YEARS SUBSCRIPTION.**

### **WARNING**

**THE PLAYING OF GOLF CAN BE A DANGEROUS PASTIME. MEMBERS AND VISITORS SHOULD ALWAYS BE AWARE OF MIS-DIRECTED GOLF BALLS AND THE USE OF MACHINERY ON THE COURSE. MAINTENANCE OF THE COURSE INVOLVES THE USE OF FERTILISERS AND DANGEROUS SPRAYS. MEMBERS SHOULD HEED THE SIGNS WHEN SUCH MATERIAL IS BEING USED AND AVOID INGESTION, BY WASHING HANDS DURING AND AFTER PLAY AND REFRAINING FROM LICKING GOLF BALLS. A SIGN WARNING OF SPRAYS BEING USED IS ON THE RIGHT HAND SIDE JUST PAST THE PRACTICE PUTTING GREEN BY THE 1<sup>ST</sup> TEE.**

## **CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION**

### **GENERAL**

**The following conditions apply to all competitions, Men's, Women's, Mixed and Juniors unless otherwise stated. MEMBERS MUST BE FINANCIAL TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPETITIONS.**

#### **1. MEN'S, JUNIORS AND MIXED HANDICAP MATCH PLAY**

**In all match play events conducted under handicap conditions, strokes will be taken by a player / side where they fall on the Stroke Index Table on the score card.**

#### **2. TIMES OF STARTING**

**All matches must be played at the time laid down by the Golf Committee on the Starting Sheet on the day or set down in the Programme Book except:**

- a. By mutual consent on a date prior to that specified.**
- b. In exceptional circumstances, at a later time/date only with the express authority of the Golf Committee.**

#### **3. HANDICAPS**

**In any Handicap Competition, the player's handicap index on the day on which the competition is played shall be the handicap index on which the player competes. If any competition extends beyond one round on another or subsequent day(s), the players' handicap index on that or subsequent day(s) shall be the handicap index on which the player competes.**

**In the stroke play and match play championships, the players handicap index on the day the entries close dictates the division the player plays in.**

#### **4. COMBINING MATCH PLAY & STROKE PLAY**

**The Rules of Golf, Rule 33-1, prohibits combining the two forms of play.**

**Therefore players competing in match play rounds cannot enter the day's event nor enter the Golf Shop Scramble which is played under stroke play rules. This Condition does not apply to entry for Holes in Two and the Jackpot.**

#### **5. MOTORISED TRANSPORT**

**The use of motorised transport is prohibited for the Stroke Play and Match Play Championships and dispensation will only be given in exceptional circumstances. From time to time, course conditions may prohibit the use of all motorised transport. Vehicles must comply with the By-Laws of the Club. Course conditions determining the use of motorized transport may be obtained by phoning the club and selecting Extension 7.**

#### **6. SIZE OF FIELD**

**The Golf Committee reserves the right to determine the minimum size of any competition field and to reduce the number of divisions in mens and womens regular weekly events. In general, no Trophy will be awarded if there are fewer than eight (8) players/sides in any event.**

## **7. POSTPONEMENTS**

**In the event of a postponement of any round of a stroke play competition due to bad weather, any player who had not previously entered that competition shall not be permitted to enter the reinstated round of that competition.**

## **8. DECISIONS OF TIES - RULE 33-6 MEN'S, MIXED & JUNIOR EVENTS**

### **A. STABLEFORD SCRAMBLE**

**By Countback.**

### **B. STROKE PLAY AND STROKE PLAY QUALIFYING INCLUDING FOURSOMES**

**Single rounds:**

- a. The last 9 holes of the round shall be counted, and the lowest declared the winner.**
- b. If still a tie, the last 6 holes of the round shall be counted and the lowest declared the winner.**
- c. If still a tie, the last 3 holes of the round shall be counted and the lowest declared the winner.**
- d. If still a tie the 18th hole of the round shall be counted and the lowest declared the winner.**
- e. If still a tie the result shall be decided by lot.**

**Multiple rounds:**

- f. The worst round of each of the competitors shall be discarded and the lowest declared the winner. If there is still a tie then-**
- g. Progressively the next worst rounds will be discarded in the same manner as (f) above. If there is still a tie then;**
- 5 The best round of each of the competitors will be considered as if it was a single round competition.**
- 6 If still a tie then the result shall be decided by lot.**

**If the event is on handicap the competitors net score shall be used.**

### **C MATCH PLAY**

**If, at the conclusion of the stipulated round, the match is tied, it shall continue from the first hole until a winner is found. The first hole is the hole where the match originally commenced. In an event played under handicap conditions, strokes shall be taken as in the original round.**

## **9. CLOSING OF ENTRIES**

**Where an Entry Sheet is posted for any competition unless otherwise stated entries shall close at noon on the Friday the week prior to the event.**

## **10. CLUB POLICY FOR USE OF BLUE CHAMPIONSHIP COURSE**

**The following policy shall apply to the Blue course.**

- a) Monday - Friday: Single figure handicap players only may play on proof of handicap.**
- b) Saturdays: Summer months: 3 times per month. Winter months: once per month. The championship tees are not available to green fee players, except for practice rounds for an event for which the**

championship tees are to be used i.e. North Harbour Stroke Play, Nobile Trophy, and Hibiscus Trophy and Kaipara Trophy Pennants.

- c) Sunday - Not available for play except for Pennants as in (b) above.

## **ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION - WOMEN**

### **11. QUALIFYING ROUNDS**

All qualifying rounds will be played over 18 holes unless otherwise stated and will be played in order of Division and / or handicap wherever possible, subject to the approval of the Golf Committee.

### **12. MATCH PLAY**

Any player defaulting in the first round of a match play competition will be ineligible for the Flight of that event.

### **13. DECISIONS OF TIES - RULE 33-6**

#### **MATCH PLAY. NZG PART 3 (A) f**

If two players are square at the finish of a match in which strokes are given, they should play a further 18 holes, unless there is a special condition to the contrary. If it is a condition of the competition that squared matches are to be continued, strokes are taken at the same holes as in the first 18 holes and the first player to win a hole wins the match.

If the match began at a hole other than the first hole, then the hole at which the match began is the first hole for that particular match and should the match be square, the 19th hole shall be the same hole as that at which the match began.

#### **STROKE PLAY. NZG PART 3 (A) g**

Stroke play ties should be decided by countback, unless otherwise stipulated.

### **COUNTBACKS**

In an 18 hole competition, the countback is done on the last 9, 6, 3, or 1 holes. In 36, 54, or 72 hole competition, it is done on the last 18, 9, 6, 3 or 1 holes. In all cases, if the tie is still unresolved, take the scores, hole by hole, counting back from the last hole. In NET events, the course handicap is deducted in proportion as follows:

Half course handicap, if decided on the last nine holes; one third handicap, if decided on the last six holes etc. In the case of more than one starting tee being used, it is recommended that, wherever possible, ties should be decided by a replay, otherwise ties should be decided on the last 9, 6, 3, 1 holes on the score card, irrespective of the order in which the holes were played.

**14. HOLE-IN-ONE FUND**

- 1. If a financial member, achieves a 'Hole-In-One' at the Huapai Golf Course, a 'hospitality grant' of up to \$150.00 will be made available to assist the successful member to extend hospitality on the day, at the 19th hole, to members and others present on the course at the time of the member's achievement. In exceptional circumstances the sum reimbursed may be increased at the discretion of the President, Club Captain or General Manager.**
- 2. The hospitality is limited to one glass per person up to the value of a handle of beer. Any person wishing to receive a drink of higher value may do so providing that person meets the additional cost. The hospitality will be extended to members and others only while the member who achieved the Hole in One is present in the bar.**
- 3. If the Hole-In-One is achieved away from the Huapai Golf Course, to be recognised it must be achieved on a course registered with and affiliated to the New Zealand Golf Association and the score card must be signed by the marker and certified by an official of the said club. A sum of up to a maximum of \$100 will be made available from the Huapai Golf Club Hole-In-One fund to assist the successful member extend hospitality, on the day, at the said club's 19th hole.**

**A Hole-in-One can only be recognised when it is the intention to play a stipulated round of golf but the round need not necessarily be completed.**

**The ball used to achieve the Hole In One will be mounted and suitably inscribed and presented to the successful member.**

**Only financial members, excluding Juniors and Limited members are eligible to receive funds from the Hole in One fund for hospitality.**

## **REGULAR CLUB EVENTS**

**NOTE: WHEN TROPHY EVENTS ARE ON, MEMBERS MUST FOLLOW THE COMPUTER SCREEN CAREFULLY TO ENSURE THEY DO NOT FIND THEMSELVES IN A COMPETITION THEY DO NOT WISH TO ENTER**

### **MEN'S EVENT OF THE DAY**

**Saturday and Wednesday fields are divided into two course handicap divisions. The Club Captain reserves the right to reduce the field to one division if there is less than 60 players. Sunday field will be in one division providing that there is a minimum of 20 players participating.**

**The handicap range in each division will be determined each week based on the number of players on the day.**

**There shall be a winner in each Division except, in the case of a Combined or Best Ball event, when there shall be a winning side.**

**Entry is optional for Full Playing and Intermediate financial members (Saturday) full playing, Sunday-Friday and Intermediate financial members (Sunday) and full playing, Intermediate, Sunday to Friday and weekday financial members (Wednesday) provided that the score card is endorsed with the day's event and is signed by both player and marker.**

**Score cards endorsed "handicap only", or which do not have the correct date or are undated will not be considered. Players involved in Club Match Play competitions will not be eligible for the days event.**

### **GIMMIES ARE NOT PERMITTED.**

**It is a condition of all regular Club competitions that, in order for a score to be considered for competition, the round must commence no later than 1.00pm according to the Starting Sheet.**

### **STABLEFORD SCRAMBLE**

**An optional event for men is operated for the Club by the Golf Shop every Saturday throughout the season and on other days at the discretion of the Golf Shop. Score cards must be endorsed in the box provided on the scorecard to indicate that the player has entered this competition. Cards not so endorsed shall not be considered.**

**Entry is optional on payment of the prescribed fee.**

### **HOLES IN TWO & JACKPOT**

**Holes in Two, open to all men and women members, is operated for the Club by the Golf Shop every Saturday and Sunday throughout the season. Holes in Two may operate on other days at the discretion of the Golf Shop.**

**A Hole In Two may be scored on any hole on the course and the definition of a Hole in Two for the purpose of eligibility also includes a Hole in One.**

**The Jackpot is struck if two Holes in Two are achieved, one on each "half" of the course, during one round.**

**The Jackpot Pool will terminate when the total number of balls reaches 48 at**

which time another Pool will start. The "live" Pool consists of 48 balls or fewer. If more than one player strikes the Jackpot, on the same day, the "live" Pool is divided equally. Multiple Jackpots can be achieved if a player scores more than one Hole in Two on any half of the course and one or more Holes in Two on the other "half" of the course. For example, a player achieves two holes in two on one half and one hole in two on the other half, the player has struck the Jackpot twice.

If, in addition, another player achieves a hole in two on each "half" of the course, the Jackpot has been struck a total of three times and the "live" Pool is divided accordingly. Entry is optional on payment of the prescribed fee.

**SCORE CARDS MUST BE ENDORSED IN THE APPROPRIATE BOX TO INDICATE THAT THE PLAYER HAS ENTERED ANY OF THESE OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS, OTHERWISE THEY WILL BE REJECTED. SIMILARLY, IF A HOLE IN TWO HAS BEEN ACHIEVED THE APPROPRIATE BOX MUST BE ENDORSED OR OTHERWISE BE EASILY DISCERNIBLE.
